Pacific Aeromodeller Club Rules

Administrative

The **Pacific Aeromodellers Club(379)** is a control line only (tethered aircraft) club that operates from a flying site in the **Abbotsford** area. All persons using these modeling sites must:

- 1) be MAAC members in good standing.
- 2) be members of the Pacific Aeromodellers Club, or an invited guest and
- 3) agree to follow the MAAC Safety code and all other club rules.

Normal operating procedures and Club safety rules

RPAS and mRPAS (sub-250) are prohibited at this site under the MAAC SOC.

The agreement with the Clayburn Village only permits recreational **control line model aircraft** operation at the site, provided we meet the following conditions:

- 1. Flying is not permitted if either site is occupied. DO NOT breach this rule wait for others to finish or come back another time.
- 2. The site is limited to operation starting at 8:00am ending 5:00pm
- 3. Members are not allowed to hold events or competitions unless the club has received an additional permission from the village.
- 4. Safety cones must be used to mark the flying area no exceptions.
- 5. Clean up after you leave do not leave any garbage or crashed airplane parts behind.
- 6. All damage to the turf, trees or other park features will be charged back to the club or members.
- 7. Always have a copy of the Village agreement with you while flying.

These rules are available in print or online.

- 1) A fire extinguisher must be present for all powered model operations.
- 2) All pre-flight inspections or assembly shall be done in the designated area.
- 3) Batteries shall not be connected to electric powered models unless the model is restrained no exceptions.
- 4) Gas/glow powered models must be restrained and started in the start-up or designated area.
- 5) Our flying area is Control line type of 150ft x 250ft including any no-by-stander zones. NOTE MAAC has variable rules stipulating NO bystanders permitted within certain distances of any flying area.
- 6) No flying will commence until 8 am and will end 5 pm, the time of which is available on the Weather Network App for the town of Abbotsford, BC
- 7) Barriers:

- a. Orange safety cones/pylons must be set up 15 meters around the southern outer edge of the flying area at 3-meter intervals.
- b. a yellow surveyors' tape must be attached to the safety cone markers on the south side of the flying area, to alert bystanders of the flying area.
- 8) MAAC "spotters" are optional at our site. The following are club procedures for ensuring bystander safety:
 - a. When any member or other person spots a by-stander approaching the flying area that might present a safety concern, they are to yell out "BY-STANDER" in a loud voice.
 - b. ALL Pilots must immediately climb the model to as high an altitude as is possible (above head height) OR land immediately. This may require an intentional forced landing/crash away from the approaching bystander.
 - c. The spotter or pilot should endeavor to warn the bystander to remain clear of the flying area and outside the safety buffer distance. Yelling in a firm loud voice "STOP stay back" and waving your arm(s) is suggested.

There are no other risk mitigating strategies required at **Pacific Aeromodellers Club**.

The Club executive will review these rules at least once a year.
