

Elk Valley Airport Flying Regulations

- Only authorized and approved RC Jet flyers from Elk Valley RC Jet Club and the RDEK are permitted to fly at Elk Valley Airport.
- Must be paid member and in good standing with Model Aeronautics Association of Canada
- 3. Must be a member or guest of Elk Valley RC Jet Club
- 4. Flying Members must carry a MAAC membership card at all times
- 5. Must follow MAAC safety code at all times
- 6. Turbine flyers must adhere to MAAC's Turbine Safety Code
- All aircraft must have safety restraints when starting and running up aircraft (brakes allowed)
- Aircraft Transceiver Radio <u>must</u> be used at all times to monitor incoming and outgoing air traffic
- All RC aircraft must yield to full size aircraft at all times, full size aircraft must never be put in jeopardy from RC aircraft.
- 10. A spotter must be used at all times and carry the Aircraft Transceiver Radio
- 11. Maximum of 2 RC aircraft may be airborne at any one time, both pilots require a spotter, one must have a transceiver radio.
- 12. No pyrotechnic or explosive devices shall be carried or activated by any model aircraft
- 13. No pulse jets or rocket engines are permitted.
- 14. No Drones are permitted
- All new aircraft must be deemed airworthy by a second qualified RC pilot
- 16. All flights must be parallel to the runways east edge (maneuver line) center line is for take offs and landings, no overhead or reckless flying will be tolerated.
- 17. There is a total alcohol ban at this airport, anyone under the influence of alcohol or drugs will be asked to leave immediately.
- 18. Anyone who violates or refuses to follow the above rules and regulations will have their flying privileges revoked by the Elk Valley RC Jet Club President and or a representative of the RDEK or Airport Management.
- 19. Please have at all times the upmost respect at this airfield, flying here is a privilege and can be revoked at anytime. Your goodwill and professionalism will build a lasting relationship with the RDEK or Elk Valley Airport Management.
- Any Damage caused that is not coved by MAAC is the responsibility of the Pilot and any other responsible party
